#### GRADE 3 / 4

In Reading, we are focusing on the comprehension strategy of Summarising. Children are reading their books and then working on following the sequence Somebody, Wanted, But, So, Then using their own words.

We are continuing to focus on handwriting on the dotted thirds lines. Students are getting confident in using the correct entry and exit points for each letter. In Grade 4, each child has set a goal for which they are aiming to achieve by the end of the year.

In Maths, we are bringing our unit on division to an end. Children have been working on solving worded problems and using concrete materials or whiteboards to help them show their working out.
