

CONGRATULATIONS




PARENT SURVEY RESULTS



- 4 Toolamba Primary School is a high quality learning facility; we need to credit our brilliant principal Heather, for guiding her teachers and creating such a positive learning environment for our children. Toolamba Primary School is a credit to our community.
 - Our children really enjoy attending school because of the wonderful teachers, peers and school environment in which they learn. The teachers are easy to talk to and have spent time during recess or lunch to assist my children when they have asked for additional help in understanding their schoolwork. The only challenge we face is that one of our children is being bullied because of his/her weight. We would only wish that the teachers taught the children the potential long-term impact of picking on others appearances.

- 6 Awards and Junior School council roles seemed to be determined by popularity, not the most deserving.
 - Students are not always placed in classes with their friends as the school promotes. This has happened several times.
- 7 I appreciate the effort of the school to introduce programs such as kitchen/garden, music and cool calm kids as well as providing access to free after school sports and activities. I fear that the pressure placed on staff to achieve high results in data collection testing is resulting in exhausted staff and stressed children. I would prefer it if the school did not use testing to judge teachers and individual children but as an opportunity to see where extra funding and resource programs may be needed. My children would also respond well to more hands on or play based learning. Perhaps more emphasis could be placed on times tables too. Overall, however, Toolamba is a wonderful school and we are fortunate to have such a fine facility in our community.

DITTO'S KEEP SAFE ADVENTURE! EDUCATION PROGRAM



On Tuesday the students in Grades Prep, 1, 2 had the opportunity to experience our Personal Safety Education Program- "The Ditto Show".

WORDS FROM BRAVEHEARTS STAFF- "We at Bravehearts are extremely proud of this program and believe that providing children with the basic principles of personal safety, we are providing them with the tools to stay safe.

Just as teaching children the road rules cannot guarantee our children's safety on the roads, no program can guarantee to "abuse-proof" our children. But, by teaching them the principles of personal safety, we are giving them the knowledge they need to keep safe and know what to do if anything does happen. It is important to bear in mind that this program is not sex education. We do not use the word 'sex' or 'sexual assault'. Its teachings are transferable to prevention of bullying, violence and sexual assault.

The performance itself consists of:

- Your body's warning signs.
- Yes and No feelings.
- Private parts (general discussion, mouth, chest, between legs & bottom: includes song)
- Scared and yucky feelings.
- What to do if someone tells you a bad secret (Run & Tell song)
- It is Ok to say NO if you feel unsafe.
- Good and Bad secrets.

When it might be Ok for a grownup to touch our private parts.

We have been able to provide this show to schools for **FREE** due to the amazing partnership and support offered by CASA: Centre Against Sexual Assault"
